A Little Visit to Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament

Jesus, the Divine Friend of Children!

As you know the attention span of our little ones is short. So let your goal be to begin 'gathering them CLOSE to Jesus in the tabernacle of their parish church or chapel.

Educate them on their surroundings, their behavior, and how to pray, while in HIS PRESENCE! TEACH THEM THE SONGS ON THE SIDE BAR.

My visit with Jesus and Sweet Mary!

Teach them the basics!

Let them know that Mary, the Mother of Jesus is always present adoring Jesus with them.

To be very quiet; this is a place for a very little voice.

Point out the red sanctuary light and its meaning, that Jesus is truly Present only HIDDEN.

Teach them how to genuflect on one knee while entering an Adoration Chapel or Church when the Jesus is Hidden in the tabernacle, and how to Genuflect with both knees as an extra sign of Love, and while on both knees to bow their little heads to Jesus, who is truly a King, the King of Heaven.

Ask your parish priest to expose Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament for the children, with incense and flowers on the altar, so you are conveying to the children there is Someone really here, and it is Someone we love.

If you have a small group of little ones, rather than go into the pews, gather them on the floor around the Blessed Sacrament. (They can make prayer mats.)

Talk to Jesus about them in their Presence so they make the connection that HE is PRESENT!

Them about how Jesus is truly present in the Host, our Hidden God. Talk about how much He loves us and wants to be loved by us. He waits for them day and night and for their whole family to come visit Him!

Teach them why we adore Jesus.

Just tell them to close their little eyes and be very very quiet, and to speak to Jesus from their hearts, I love you Jesus! Throw HIM kisses!

Let them know that whenever they need something or feel troubled, to come to HIM where He is present... in every Catholic Church or Adoration Chapel, and to bring Mom and Dad, brothers and sisters.
